The Endocrine Society would like to thank you for introducing the Senate Companion to the Combatting Sexual Harassment in Science Act of 2019. The Endocrine Society supports your effort to reduce sexual harassment in the scientific workforce.

Furthermore, we are encouraged that the legislation establishes a new research program at the National Science Foundation to examine the prevalence of and factors contributing to sexual harassment in the scientific workforce.
